Invitation

Have you undertaken a course in DCM, or do you have a broad insight in the DCM method and theories behind it? Are you keen to learn from other institutions experiences with DCM and do you want to examine the key foundations to successful DCM implementation? If so then please sign up to join an inspiring workshop in Copenhagen 28 September!

Today DCM (Dementia Care Mapping) is widely used in health and social care organizations all over the world. This workshop looks at how we can use the tool more efficiently to bring person centred care into the dementia care institutions in Denmark. Key themes such as organizational readiness and implementation will be discussed. Ideas to translate DCM-language to pedagogical daily life language will be shown. Key DCM projects from UK and Denmark will be shared to allow greater understanding of what the tool can do. Knowing that the DCM tool itself is not enough to bring about a change in the quality of person centred care, this workshop aims to widen our understanding for successful implementation of DCM.

Acknowledge our workshop as a step forward to improve the quality of life for persons with dementia, their caregivers and family members.

Paul Edwards is a DCM Consultant Trainer employed at Bradford Dementia Group, University of Bradford. Since 2001 he has run numerous DCM courses across the UK as well as overseas. Paul provides consultancy services for organizations seeking to improve the quality of person-centred care all over the world. He has used DCM extensively across independent health and social services, and first started using the method in 1995.

Some of his current projects include working with a large NHS mental health trust developing a 'whole' service approach to developing and evaluating person centred care and projects aimed at developing DCM across acute medical services. Paul is joint editor of 'DCM - Experience and Insights into Practice' (with Dawn Brooker and Sue Benson) published in 2004. Paul has a significant interest in the worldwide spread of person centred care and DCM. Paul is also assisting with the development of the new person centred care planning tool due to be published later this year.

Paul's research interest currently is around the cost/ benefits of DCM for organizations. He is currently undertaking and MBA at the University of Bradford's School of Management

Vibeke Drevsen Bach, DK

Vibeke Drevsen Bach is a DCM Mapper, Evaluator and Consultant Trainer. She works as mapper, supervisor, process- and development consultant in Dementia Center Pilehuset, a huge residence and daycare center in the city of Copenhagen. Vibeke has united Tom Kitwood's theory of person-centred care with DCM terminology into one metaphor – a simple, pedagogical and at the same time complex, powerful and organizational transformative "picture and language tool". The metaphor is now being integrated in the daily work, in supervision, DCM-feedbacks and acting plans. Vibeke is in the process of writing a book on the metaphorical approach to organizational transformation. of her experiences in using this metaphor as a transformative tool. She has a passion in energizing and gently support directors and staff to find their own way of transforming so they can more easily work on a "fully and truly person centred" approach in their specific roles within the organization. Vibeke is educated as a home economist and has a diploma in leadership, organizational and staff development on a systemically, narrative and appreciative approach. For many years Vibeke has worked in managements positions in huge international nongovernmental organizations. Latest as a director in Livslinien, a suicide prevention hotline and foundation. Vibeke is currently undertaking a Master in Process- and Organization consultation.

General Information

Who can attend?

The workshop is for professionals with a previous knowledge of the DCM Method and the theories of person centred care. The workshop is of relevance to service managers, directors and dementia care providers working at residential homes, day care facilities etc.

Please note that seats at the workshop are limited to 65 persons. When the workshop is full, the following persons who register will be put on a waiting list. The secretariat will inform you whether you are accepted, on a waiting list or – due to enough on the waiting list – rejected.

Fees

The workshop fee is **DKK 975**. However, professionals working within the Health & Care Administration of the City of Copenhagen (Københavns Kommunes Sundheds- og Omsorgsforvaltning) may participate for free, as the Health & Care Administration will cover their fee. All others must pay the full fee.

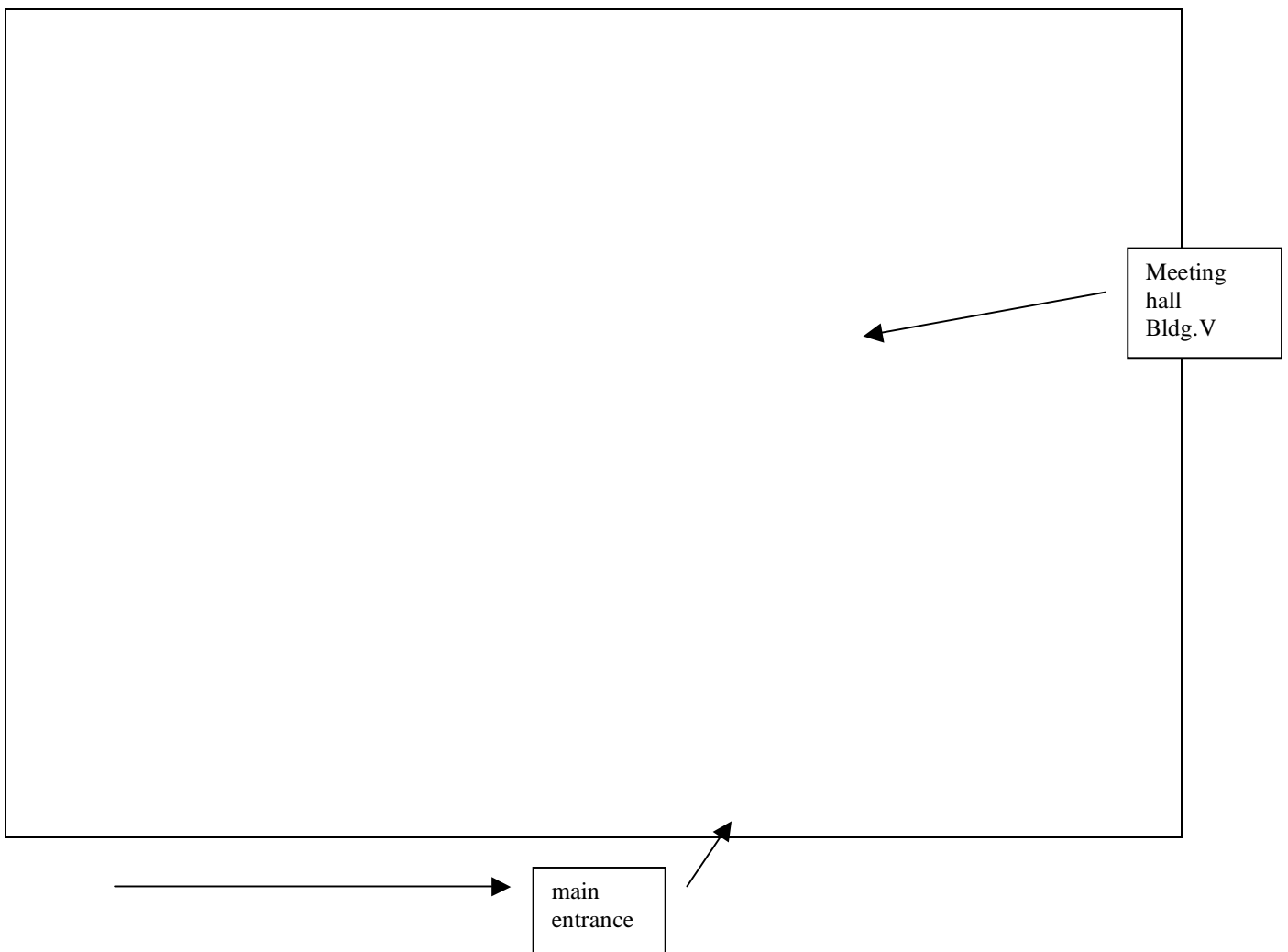
